- I.** The award may be given annually to an engineer of recognized standing, who must be an ASCE member in good standing, a licensed professional engineer, and practice within one of the counties in the Central Illinois Section.
- II.** Qualifications of the award nominees will be judged on the following: sustained outstanding civil engineering performance; evidence of high character and professional integrity; civic and humanitarian activities (community service); minimum of fifteen years of service as a civil engineer; five of the fifteen years at the senior administrative level; and presently employed as an engineer.
- III.** The award consists of a suitably inscribed certificate.
- IV.** Nominations for Central Illinois Section Civil Engineer of the Year Award should contain a nominating statement of 200 words or less giving biographical information, citations of merit, and accomplishments which deserve consideration of the Award.
- V.** Recipients of the award are selected by the Awards Committee for final action by the Central Illinois Section Board.
- VI.** Members of Central Illinois Section Board shall not be eligible for this award.

Criteria:

- I.** The award may be given annually to an engineer of recognized standing, who must be an ASCE member in good standing, a licensed professional engineer, and practice within one of the counties in the Central Illinois Section.
- II.** Qualifications of the award nominees will be judged on the following: sustained outstanding civil engineering performance in the public sector; evidence of high character and professional integrity; civic and humanitarian activities (community service); minimum of fifteen years of public service as a civil engineer; five of the fifteen years at the senior administrative level; and presently employed in the U.S. public sector.
- III.** The award consists of a suitably inscribed certificate.
- IV.** Nominations for Central Illinois Section Government Civil Engineer of the Year Award should contain a nominating statement of 200 words or less giving biographical information, citations of merit, and accomplishments which deserve consideration of the Award.
- V.** Recipients of the award are selected by the Awards Committee for final action by the Central Illinois Section Board.
- VI.** Members of Central Illinois Section Board shall not be eligible for this award.

THE AWARD:

This award was established to recognize distinguished young civil engineers for demonstrated leadership potential and significant engineering contributions.

Criteria:

- I.** The award may be given annually to an engineer of recognized standing, who must be an Affiliate Member, Associate Member, or Member of ASCE, age thirty-five years or less on February 1, 2009, an engineer of recognized leadership potential, employed full time for a minimum of five (5) years as of February 1, 2009, presently employed as an engineer, and practice within one of the counties in the Central Illinois Section.. E.I.T. or P.E. certification is required of all candidates.
- II.** Qualifications of the award nominees will be judged on the following: excellent performance that has demonstrated leadership potential in civil engineering, evidence of high character and professional integrity, civic and humanitarian activities (community service), outstanding contributions to ASCE.
- III.** The award consists of a suitably inscribed certificate.
- IV.** Nominations for Central Illinois Section Young Civil Engineer of the Year Award should contain a nominating statement of 200 words or less giving biographical information, citations of merit, and accomplishments which deserve consideration of the Award.
- V.** Recipients of the award are selected by the Awards Committee for final action by the Central Illinois Section Board.
- VI.** Members of Central Illinois Section Board shall not be eligible for this award.
