#### **Robotics Competition**

FIRST (For Inspiration and Recognition of Science and Technology) programs have been an integral part of the STEM program's enrichment activities. Inventor and entrepreneur Dean Kamen founded FIRST over 20 years ago, creating a school-to-career pipeline through which young people are inspired to explore opportunities in science and technology. He believed that inspiring young people and encouraging their schools and communities to appreciate science and technology could positively transform culture. FIRST has successfully formed coalitions with corporations, universities, and public schools to become the premier after-school engineering and robotics competition program in the nation.

Studies show that, compared to their peers, FIRST participants are 2.3 times more likely to show in increased interest in STEM careers and 2.7 times more likely to show an increase in STEM understanding. In Alaska, we're seeing concrete examples of how the school-to-career pipeline works. Graduating Lathrop High School senior, Zach Lanis, plans to study mechanical engineering at Portland State University. "FIRST has influenced that decision, almost in its entirety. I have found a love for building robots, doing materials research, machining parts, and tracking progress in an engineering notebook through FIRST that I have decided to pursue it as a lifelong career. FIRST has not only shown me what I want to study for the next 4 years, but what I want to do for the next 40." Graduating senior, Hanah Elizarde, of Juneau plans to study nursing in the fall. Although she doesn't plan to pursue engineering, she says that FIRST still had an impact on her decision. "FIRST has taught me the importance of critical thinking and helping others through community outreach and the concept of gracious professionalism."

Alaska's FIRST program continues to impact more young Alaskans each year. During the 2017-2018 season, FIRST in Alaska experienced a 17% increase in geographic reach around the state, expanding from 53 communities to 62. Our overall team count grew by 16% from 255 to 295. In Juneau, we strive to have FIRST available at all of our public schools. This season, Juneau will host the Southeast Regional Qualifiers for both FIRST LEGO League (grades 4-8) and FIRST Tech Challenge (grades 7-12). In addition to mentors and coaches throughout the season, JEDC will need to recruit nearly 100 volunteers to support these events.

## **Introduce a Girl to Engineering Day**

The Girl Scouts of Alaska and Exxon Mobil are hosting an "Introduce a Girl to Engineering Day" on Saturday, September 22<sup>nd</sup>; from 9am to 3pm at Centennial Hall. The Girl Scouts of Alaska are looking for Juneau engineers who would like to join the engineers of Exxon Mobil to give 6-8th grade girls an introduction to engineering. It would be great for the Girl Scouts to have women engineers volunteer for this event, but all Juneau engineers are encouraged to sign up.

The day will consist of teams of Girl Scouts working their way through a group of engineering challenges. Volunteer engineers will serve as mentors for each team. Lunch will be provided for all girls and volunteers, and will include a question and answer session.
