Michigan Still Not Making the Grade

The Michigan Section of the American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE) announced recently that Michigan is STILL not making the grade after receiving an overall "D" grade for infrastructure two years ago.

Michigan lawmakers have been deadlocked for years on how to adequately fund transportation infrastructure. As a result, 35 percent of Michigan's roads are in poor condition, 2010 data show. Nearly one-third of Michigan's bridges were deemed functionally obsolete or structurally deficient. Since the 2009 infrastructure report card gave Michigan a "D", nothing has been done by Michigan leaders to fix the state's broken transportation funding system.
