# The Detroit / Wayne County Port Authority Dock

The Detroit / Wayne County Port Authority has just completed the new public dock and terminal building, located in a prominent area on the Detroit River adjacent to the Renaissance Center. The 250-foot long dock was built offsore to allow sufficient depth of major cruise ships. The project also rehabilitated the existing shoreline, constituting the final linkage to the East Riverwalk between the recently renovated Civic Center and GM Promenades. The dock will be used for cruise ships and other important docking on the Detroit River.

Charles J. Roarty, Jr., P.E. with NTH consultants will be presenting on the variety of design and permitting issues along with challanges during construction. The presentation is scheduled for November 17, 2011 and will include a site visit and lunch at nearby Andiamo restaurant.

# Governor Signs SB77

Legislation returns statute of limitations to 2 years for Professional Engineers / Architects / Surveyors and prevents stale claims - 10/7/2011



After a 5+ year effort by the ACEC Political Affairs team, Senate Bill

77 was signed into law by Governor Rick Snyder on October 4, 2011 and becomes Public Act 162 of 2011.

In February 2006, a Michigan Supreme Court decision (Ostroth v. Warren Regency) overruled existing case law and lengthened all limitation periods for claims against Engineers, Architects, Surveyors and Contractors. Based on an ACEC National survey, Michigan's statute of limitations for design professionals became the longest in the country.

ACEC/Michigan, along with industry partners, first introduced legislation in September 2006 to correct the decision. Throughout two legislative sessions (2007-2008 and 2009-

2010) bills passed the Senate but died each session on the floor of the House of Representatives. In January 2011, design professionals recruited Senator Tonya Schuitmaker to introduce Senate Bill 77. In February, the bill was voted out of the Senate 35-1 and on September 20 the bill was voted out of the House 87-21. The bill will take effect on January 1, 2012.

SB 77 solves the problems created by Ostroth by restoring the applicable limitation periods to their previous durations and restores the long-established rules that govern them. The legislation will bar stale claims and require plaintiffs to be diligent in bringing claims forward in a timely manner. It puts Michigan's statute back in line with the other states across the country and makes Michigan more business-friendly for Professional Engineers, Architects and Surveyors.

Although it took over 5 years, the correcting of this decision was of great importance to A/E firms and contractors and will reduce the costs of litigation and risk for years to come. Limitation periods have long been part of Michigan's public policy and were established to encourage prompt recovery of damages while the information is fresh and the individuals involved are still readily available.
