## **Civil PE Exam Review Course (Begins** Monday, February 5th)

If you know someone who is taking the exam on April 14, 2018, please pass this information along. If you would like to sit in on some of the sessions as a refresher for PDHs, you may register for a single session (or more) also.



The PE Civil exam review course will be held at the Lipscomb University Fields Engineering Center and will be available via a videoconferencing link. As we have in the past, the course will be taught by Professional Engineers and based on the Civil Engineering Reference Manual (Lindeburg 15th edition). It will focus on the "breadth" (morning) portion of the

exam and will include the general topics covered during the morning part of the exam. Seismic and land surveying will not be covered, as they are not covered on the morning exam. Sessions include Water Resources, Geotechnical, Structural, Construction and Transportation.

The registration form is posted <u>HERE</u>. The cost will be \$350 per person for members and \$550 for nonmembers and will include TSPE membership free for 6 months.

# City of Spring Hill, TN - Public Works Superintendent

#### **DEFINITION**

This is a skilled, full time exempt position under the direct supervision of the



Infrastructure Director.

This employee plans, directs, manages, and oversees the activities and operations of the various divisions of public works including water distribution, wastewater collection, yard and bulky waste pickup, fleet maintenance services, building and grounds maintenance, traffic technicians, and street rights of way maintenance, mowing, and street, sidewalk, curb and gutter maintenance. He or she exercises supervision over unskilled, semi-skilled and skilled employees throughout the department.

#### QUALIFICATIONS

High School Diploma or GED required. Bachelor degree in a related field of study such as engineering, construction technology, public works, business administration or public administration AND 7+ years of related experience; OR 10+ years of progressively responsible related work experience required.

Valid Tennessee driver's license required. CDL preferred.

5+ years of supervisory work experience required.

#### ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS OF THE JOB

The duties listed below are intended only as illustrations of the various types of work that may be performed. The omission of specific statements of duties does not exclude them from the position if the work is similar, repeated or a logical assignment to this class. Directs the development and implementation of Public Works Departmental goals, objectives, policies and priorities.

Monitors and evaluates the efficiency and effectiveness of service delivery methods and procedures.

Selects, trains, motivates and evaluates Public Works Department personnel, implementing discipline when necessary.

Coordinates work plans and strategies, and assigns projects through subordinate level supervisory and managerial personnel.

Participates in the development and administration of Public Works Department budget, including expenditure controls and requisition approval.

Prepares and presents information regarding Public Works activities to other city departments, elected officials and the general public.

Communicates both orally and in writing with federal, state and local regulatory officials and agencies. Ensures that adequate staff resources and equipment are available to complete assigned projects and tasks. Receives the public and responds to questions, requests and complaints.
