

ASCE Nashville Branch Board Pledges to Help Place Dream Big: Engineering Our World Film DVDs in Area Schools this Fall

The film <u>Dream Big: Engineering Our</u> <u>World</u> by McGillivray Freeman Films will be available for educational purposes on DVD starting this fall. The Nashville Branch Board has pledged to sponsor a Dream Big DVD toolkit for all public schools serving grades 6-8 in Middle TN. ASCE Headquarters is going to match our Board's contribution by providing DVDs for half of the middle schools in the area. Additionally, the



United Engineering Foundation (UEF) has provided a grant to put a copy of the DVD in each high school; therefore, we are focusing on middle school-aged children for our pledge.
