In Memoriam

ASCE Nashville Branch mourns the loss of Jesse Taylor Perry. "Jess" was one of our most active Life Members and a true asset to ASCE and the engineering community, and he loved his profession. He was President of the ASCE Nashville Section from 1974-1975 (before we had a separate Nashville Branch and Tennessee Section, which started in 1988) and the father of Nashville Branch Past President, Jon Perry. The Dyers are the only other parent/child team that has served that office.



Jess earned a Bachelor's Degree in Civil Engineering from Vanderbilt University in 1957 on an Army ROTC Scholarship, and served the Army and Army Reserve until he resigned his commission in 1966 at the rank of Captain. He worked as a civil engineer for TVA for 3 years and then for the Nashville District of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers until his retirement in 1999.

Jess was also a life-long member of TSPE and SAME. He taught A-E Contracting to hundreds of consultants hoping to contract with the Army Corps of Engineers and other Federal agencies. He was considered a national expert in this area.


