School Supply Drive at July Lunch Meeting

We will be collecting school supplies and donations for the LP Pencil Box at the July Branch Lunch Meeting.



The LP PENCIL Box is a non-profit partner with Metro Nashville Public Schools (MNPS) that works to obtain and warehouse school supplies for teachers across MNPS. You can learn more about the LP PENCIL BOX <u>HERE</u>. Many of the students in MNPS are at or below poverty levels, which means an estimated 9 out of 10 teachers are likely using their own money to provide school supplies for their students. Local teachers have the opportunity to "shop" once per semester for FREE school supplies at the warehouse, often picking up the basic supplies (glue, crayons, paper, backpacks) for students in their classrooms that otherwise would go without. Also, teachers can't use school funds to purchase cleaning supplies like wipes, etc. to clean up from very cool, but sometimes messy hands-on projects that they do with their students. Everything in the store is donated, so the LP PENCIL Box relies on groups like ours to help them fill the bins with the necessary supplies for teachers.

Key items needed right now are listed below (new items only):

- Composition Notebooks
- Paper Towels
- Hand Sanitizer
- Staplers/Staples
- Tissue Boxes
- Ziplock Bags
- Tape/Tape Dispensers
- Pencil Boxes
- Pencils (No. 2 and Colored)
- Dry Erase Markers
- Sharpies
- Calculators
- Rulers, Compasses and Protractors
- Graphing Paper

This event should be very informative as well as an interesting behind the scenes view of a local water treatment plant here in Nashville. The event will be held Wednesday, July 19th from 8:30 AM to noon. Lunch afterwards TBD.

A portion of the tour is outside and includes stairs and metal grates dress accordingly and prepare for inclement weather. Flat, closed toe shoes are required. PICTURES ARE NOT ALLOWED. Civil PE and FE Exam Review Courses

PE Review Begins Monday, August 14th

If you know someone who is taking the PE exam on October 27, 2017, please pass this information along. If you would like to sit in on some of the sessions as a refresher for PDHs, you may register for a single session (or more) also.


The PE Civil exam review course will be held at the Fields Engineering Center - on the campus of Lipscomb University this Fall. The course will be available statewide and available via a videoconferencing link.

As we have in the past, the course will be taught by Professional Engineers and based on the *Civil Engineering Reference Manual* (Lindeburg - Latest edition). It will focus on the "breadth" (morning) portion of the exam and will include the general topics covered during the morning part of the exam. Seismic and land surveying will not be covered, as they are not covered on the morning exam. Sessions include Hydrology, Waste & Water Treatment Facilities, Concrete and Steel Design, and Transportation.

The online registration form is <u>HERE</u>. The cost will be \$350 per person for members and \$550 for nonmembers and will include TSPE membership free for 6 months.

FE Review Begins Tuesday, September 19th

ASCE is pleased to announce that we will also be hosting, alongside Lipscomb University, TSPE, and TDOT, an FE Review course beginning September 19 and ending January 30. The course will be held at the Fields Engineering Building on the school's campus and will also be streamed and available for off-site attendees. The course will meet on Tuesday evenings from 5:30-7:30. Additional details will be coming soon.
