

# Middle Tennessee STEM Expo - April 9th at MTSU - Thanks to Volunteers

For several years, ASCE has helped sponsor the Middle TN STEM Expo where students present their science, engineering, and technology projects in a science fair format. This year we had several volunteers help with our booth and judging projects. The STEM Expo had 645 students and 297 projects on display from 45 K-12 schools in the Middle TN region. ### ACE Mentors - Nashville is Looking for Engineers to get Involved

ACE (Architecture, Construction, and Engineering) Mentors is an after school program for high school students focused on developing skills and introducing students to careers in ACE fields through projects. The Nashville Affiliate serves Davidson, Williamson, and Rutherford Counties. This year we had approximately 130 students registered to participate in the Nashville area ACE Mentor program. The annual award banquet was held in April with each team presenting their project and ACE awarding 28 scholarships to students toward pursuing degrees in related fields in college. Most student teams meet once every two weeks to work on a project throughout the school year. It can be a rewarding experience and if you don't have time to commit to the entire academic year, there are opportunities to get involved for only a session or a few. 

Goodwyn, Mills, Cawood is currently seeking an entry level Project Engineer to join our water and wastewater



municipal group. The Project Engineer will have the opportunity to work on a combination of local and regional projects with a variety of scopes and applications. Working with senior engineers the primary duties of the Project Engineer include creating detailed designs of water and wastewater treatment systems, distribution systems and collection systems, and supporting implementation of infrastructure improvements through construction phase services. Specific design responsibilities include preparing plans for water and wastewater systems, hydraulic

calculations, writing specifications, technical reports for water and wastewater treatment, distribution, and collection systems, determining appropriate design methods, and equipment sizing and selection. Construction phase responsibilities include serving as owner's representative, coordination of inspection/observation activities, review and response to shop drawings, submittals, requests for clarification and other construction related correspondence, coordination of startup, commissioning and acceptance activities. The ideal candidate should have strong verbal and written communication skills and be a highly organized and responsive individual, capable of working in a diverse team environment and handling multiple tasks with competing priorities. Other responsibilities include, but are not limited to:

- \* Perform hydraulic and hydrologic calculations and apply fundamental engineering principals to develop design solutions
- \* Prepare cost opinions and write technical documents
- \* Develop life cycle cost analyses and process calculations
- \* Conduct field work and data collection \* Perform inspection duties to oversee the installation of various municipal projects
- \* GIS integration and hydraulic modeling \* State permitting
