The Need for Authentic Leadership in Civil Engineering



Clint Adler, P.E. is a UAF Graduate where he earned his B.S. in Civil Engineering in 1991 and his M.S. in Environmental Engineering in 1998. He spent the last 30 years working for the State of Alaska, holding various leadership positions such as Chief Engineering Support & Plan Review Engineer for the Department of Environmental Conservation. For the Department of Transportation & Public Facilities he has served as the Chief of Research, Development, & Technology Transfer and is currently the Chief of the Mat-Su District Office. Clint was serving as the 2003/2004 President of the ASCE Fairbanks Branch when the Fairbanks Chapter of the Alaska Society of Professional Engineers named him "Young Engineer of the Year".

Civil Engineers tend to be great technical managers. However, there is a great need for civil engineers to assume leadership roles in their communities and in our society. The formal education of Civil Engineers often does not prepare them for authentic leadership. Indeed, many seasoned engineers do not accurately distinguish between management and leadership. We will broadly explore some key characteristics of, and opportunities for authentic leadership in our profession.
