PE Review Course

Civil PE Exam Review Course Begins Monday, February 15

If you know someone who is taking the exam in April 2021, please pass this information along. If you would like to sit in on some of the sessions as a refresher for PDHs, you may register for a single session (or more) also.

The PE Civil exam review course will be a web-based offering through Microsoft Teams. We believe that the web-based course will allow students to safely attend the course and interact with the instructors.

As we have in the past, the course will be taught by Professional Engineers and based on the *Civil Engineering Reference Manual* (Lindeberg 16th edition). It will focus on the "breadth" (morning) portion of the exam and will include the general topics covered during the morning part of the exam. Seismic and land surveying will **not** be covered, as they are not covered on the morning exam. Sessions include Water Resources, Geotechnical, Structural, Construction, and Transportation.

The registration form is located <u>HERE</u>. The cost will be \$350 per person for members and \$550 for non-members and will include TSPE membership free for 6 months. All registrations must be received no later than February 12.


Volunteers for Branch Leadership
